In the afternoon, Jeremy Baldwin brought a presentation on feed supplementation that can be used to be cost effective with the high costs of input and to maintain herd health and reproductivity.

Christy Herr, DVM discussed Epizootic Hemorrhagic Disease (EHD) a disease found in deer that can be transmitted to cattle and can cause laminitis, decreased milk production & fetus deformities.

Several head of Charolais cattle were on display including herd sires.
